# Colouring Country with Iltja Ntjarra (Many Hands) Art Centre



Iltja Ntjarra (Many Hands) Art Centre was established in 2004 by the Ngurratjuta/Pmara Ntjarra Aboriginal Corporation and is located in Alice Springs, NT.

The Hermannsburg/Namatjira School of Art Watercolour Movement is the longest running contemporary art-making practice in Australian art history.

Iltja Ntjarra artists work to share their skills and stories in honour of Albert Namatjira, his contemporaries and the long line of Elders that have maintained this strong tradition for over 80 years. By continuing this legacy these artists actively sustain an important piece of their living culture.



#### Here's what we do:

Step 1 - Print page 2.

**Step 2** – Choose your colouring in material (we suggest something that will be heavy enough to cover the numbers e.g. acrylic paint or marker). You might even like to try watercolour.
